Stage I (1993-1996)

- Main issue: NATO enlargement
- Russian choice:
 To acquiesce or to oppose?
- Czech discourse: Russia as a threat

Stage II (1997-1999)

- Decision about NATO enlargement
- Russia: cold peace with the CR
- Czech discourse: "Russia can indeed have her interests in the CR just like we can in Patagonia."

Stage III (since 2000)

- Putin's rise to power (pragmatism)
- Main issues:
 - -debt payment
 - -visa regime
 - -EU enlargement
- Series of official visits

Why So Late?

- Objective factors
 - -geography ⇒ no Eastern policy
- "Construction of identity" factors
 - -,,return to Europe" obsession
 - -small country complex
 - -special role of Czech Communists
